Signage was asked about. Can't be more than 20 square feet said Jeff Parizo but she was urged to check with the zoning administer about it.

Linda Effel wanted to discuss the FY 18. Adam White told her that FY 18 would have begun on July 1, 2017 and ended on June 30th 2018. Linda Effel said that Melissa Boutin referred to her bereavement in FY 18, but it actually occurred in FY 19 because her

husband passed away in August of 2018. And the reference to her injury which happened in Aug. of 2019 which is fiscal year 20. Linda Effel expressed confusion about Melissa Boutin stating that her FY 18 overtime was not because Linda Effel was off. She worked full-time through FY 18. Linda Effel wanted to clear up the overtime dates. Adam White stated that this was likely in error as the overtime was approved at a later date in executive session. In looking through the minutes of the previous meeting, there is no actual date attached to the overtime statements. So there is no need to amend the minutes. Ellen Howrigan added that the discussion of Linda Effel's health and other issues was completely out of line in terms of what was disclosed by our Town Treasurer showed a lack of class and respect toward Linda Effel.

Highway Department Update Storm had the guys plowing and sanding. It was an icy mess with plow trucks unable to stop at intersection, but they sanded and it was better. Steve, the new hire, did a great job for his cost storm. "As far as I know there was only 3 or 4 mailboxes that fell down." Part-timer was plugged in at \$21 an hour times 25 hours a week, comes to \$525 a week time 30 weeks comes to \$15,750 a year.

Finally, the Road Commissioner's salary is \$6000. Ron Bushway as Commissioner is \$21 an hour but is cannot exceed \$6,000. \$147,600 is the total for labor for the highway department.

Jeff Parizo asks Ron Bushway his thoughts on the Road Commissioner being salaried. At this time if we stick to two people most of the overtime is in the winter. Ron Bushway says at this time he doesn't think anyone would want to be salaried. Jeff Parizo says that he thinks at some point this should be an administrative position. Eric Godin agrees with

Jeff Parizo and states that a salaried manager would probably be someone not driving the truck. And if he wasn't driving the truck, the manager would lose a lot of overtime.

Ron Bushway and Brad Sheridan met with Melissa Boutin and she helped straighten out some numbers, including the fish hatchery expenses.

\$485,670 is the total being asked for from taxes. Several grants are helping to offset the total expenditures. Jeff Parizo asks Couper Shaw about the \$1,500 line item for computers. Couper Shaw states the part of the new IT program covers all the town computers. So that \$1,500 line item could go into the Town General Fund. Adam White asks about the sand and salt budget and suggests we move the \$1,500 for computers to the salt/sand line item making it \$29,500.

Total to be raised by taxes for the Highway Department is \$ 670 called general maintenance on the Highway Budget.

Adam White makes a motion to approve the Highw t for FY 24 to put on the ballot in the amount of \$485,670. Jeff Par seconds. Passes ur ously.

per Shaw co dn't get a hold of Stowe or Morrisville's town clerk, but he did speak with Hero. They do not have a second signer on any of their accounts. As far as and Sou neither Milton or South Hero had a policy in place to make people take takin ley encourage treasurer to take vacation every year. Milton has a use it or lose it policy with vacation pay. If it's not used by the end of year, you lose the time and they don't pay it out. The Grand Isle policy is a maximum of 240 hours can be accrued. Only time vacation time is paid out is upon separation from Grand Isle.

John Lafayette questioned Couper Shaw about reaching the Morrisville Town Clerk who told him that no one reached him. Couper Shaw left a message with the number posted on the.

Ellen Howrigan states that Grand Isle should make the treasurer take five consecutive days off. Closing the office defeats the purpose of having someone take over the duties of the Treasurer. This is the reason you have someone else take over the office is to see how the work has been done.

Adam White asks what is an appropriate amount for dual signers on the check book. The discussion came around to not having a second signer because the Selectboard cannot be a signer according to statute, but rather how will the Selectboard look at invoices and sign off on them. Jeff Parizo suggests having a stamp and designating someone at the organizational meeting to be the one who authorizes payment of the invoices over a certain amount. Stamp invoices it, date it and sign it and give copies to all the Board.

Adam White moves to item #3 of Batchelder's list that states there were instances where invoices were not approved. So, let's have a system where all department heads sign off on their invoices and the Selectboard then would sign off on those. Selectboard would have a stamp: date, time reviewed, and signature.

Jeff Parizo sums up, so the Chair would review the invoices. "In good with that." The Selectboard will now eyeball every invoice. Jeff Parizo states that the organizational meeting a Selectboard would give either the Chair or the fice Chair e power to review the invoices. Then designate a back up in case Chair or Vice chair. We'dere be stamping the invoices.

Jeff Parizo asks Adam White if he's going to be this new solicy of reviewing invoices in a standard operating procedure policy. We'n add a SOP' to be documents Selectboard members sign after Town Meeting such as conflict a therest. Included in this will be a fact sheet that lays out the policies i.e., Selectboard must off on CDs, etc. This would a document that needs to be signed by all members.

Adam White brings up the time av y personal mentions that the personnel manual does not cover elected officials. Adam White asks the bould reach out to the town attorney to see what he's seen on this matter.

Bianca Lafaye' ask about elected officials and what recourse does the Board have. The Board has prosay over a m. Jean Prouty sks about whether elected officials are mandated by State 30. The like as tate worker would be.

Josie Leavitt says this brings up a good idea which is how can you mandate that an elected official take five days. There must be a rule book that all elected officials are under that can offer guidance. Adam White says if it's an appointed position they report to the Selectboard, if elected they report to the people.

Joe Longo asks how that works with the Listers. "It's different how it works with listers."

Adam White talks about SOPs and SOG (standard operating guidelines). The procedures are more rules and the guidelines are suggestions. How to convey Selectboard history with every new board. Creating a living document is one good way to do that. It can be as simple as the Grand Isle Selectboard must approve all certificates of deposit for the town. #5 on the list

Universal time sheets to be implemented. The audit revealed our time sheets are lacking. Adam White created a sample time sheet for all workers of the town use the exact time sheet. He asks if this works. Josie Leavitt says no. Adam White then says do we want an in and out part to this. Eric Godin adds that he's pretty sure the in out has to be there to be in compliance with labor laws.

Diane Cota asks, "As a lister who supervises our time sheets." Selectboard could approve it, but as long as your department is within your budget that's about all we can do, Adam White responds. Jeff Parizo suggests that the Board get the detailed EMRC payroll report so Board could be shown accrued vacation, sick time, etc. Adam white says for elected officials the Selectboard does not have to approve the time show All non-elected officials have to go through the process. Library can designate a supervision of sign off on time sheets.

Linda Effel asks is the town clerk hourly or salary? And would they a have to use the time sheet. But technically as an elected official work can compel them to be the time sheet. Adam White will ask the town attorney about this. Town Clerk is currently and this will be discussed at the next meeting.

Jeff Parizo will follow up with Wendy Wilton at NovaC about time cards and full modules.

Emily Clark makes suggestion the sheet be similar to easier to input.

Randy Gover asks why don't just put time clocks in

Bianca Adams asks where is Melissa Boutin's spreadsheet about her time spent at the school. Jeff Parizo says his understanding was Melissa Boutin was going to pull together a spreadsheet from payroll and we don't have that yet. Melissa Boutin did not said she was going to do such a thing and Jeff Parizo says he heard it on the Zoom meeting.

Jeff Parizo brings up that it's hard to hear Melissa Boutin when she sits behind the board. It's hard in person and harder on Zoom or on the LCATV. Jean Prouty agrees with Jeff Parizo. Eric Godin tells folks how sensitive the microphones are so please refrain from side conversations because the mics pick them up. Rachel Griggs suggests getting the old recorder set up again. Couper Shaw mentions that Melissa is here on her own free will, , she doesn't have to show up at any Selectboard meeting and if we start saying she has to sit here or there, she might now show up at all.

Adam White let's go back to the initial question about the GITSD invoice and look at the spreadsheet. Bianca Lafayette says, the school reimburses the town for Melissa Boutin's time for preparing the town report and the school part of it. And the town pays Melissa Boutin for her time during the day for creating the town report.

Bianca Lafayette, so you guys are already paying her for her time. Why is she on top of this paying herself \$1,000. So why are you guys paying her her hourly rate.

Adam White: there are 2 parts. Compensation for the town portion and the school portion. They're paying you a reimbursement.

Melissa Boutin: the time is divided out. The town gets charged for their portion and the school gets charged for their portion.

Bianca Lafayette: Why are they reimbursing the Town? and not page Melissa Bouting directly from the school

Bianca Lafay wasks Jefrarizo how has Melisssa Boutin accrued so much comp time when she's not witled to overtime? Jeff Parizo says he never said that Melissa Boutin was ever not entitle to overtime. But elected officials are not entitled to overtime. Bianca syette says a shouldn't even be entitled to it. Jeff Parizo adds when Melissa Boutin can be us in 16 or 20 and asked for overtime are we saying now that we the Selectboard did some and shouldn't have? Josie Leavitt adds, this might be something for the town attorney adam White offers that the Selectboard at the time didn't know any differently. They just knew that anything over 40 hours was overtime.

Josie Leavitt will send an email to VLCT about the comp time. Ellen Howrigan asks why the Selectboard hasn't shifted Town Clerk from hourly to salaried. Jeff Parizo says as far as he knows, it had always been salaried and at some point it shifted. We can change it anytime we want it to. We need to look at and understand where we're at. Jeff Parizo says I think talking about this budget is where we'll have that discussion.

Emily Clark asked if other towns will show similar school charges as Grand Isle does. Adam White says no because we're the only town that charges the school district. Emily Clark continues that comp time isn't something she can do, and both Jeff Parizo and Adam White say that it's a municipal thing. And it's programmed in NEMRC.

Jeff Parizo would like to see the Town Clerk and Town Treasurer salary broken out separately in case the jobs become two people and not just one.

Bianca Lafayette asks if we can stop charging the school. Adam White says yes, but not at this meeting because we haven't warned it. Adam White would like to know what are the costs if there's a special meeting and if we should add \$2,000 as a line item as an emergency fund.

Josie Leavitt asks about paying listers the election stipend if it's their day to work and it's election day. It was discussed that folks should be paid as election officials and not get their regular salary as well on election day. Are you getting your regular and your election pay?
